It rains a lot around Lake Chuzenji.

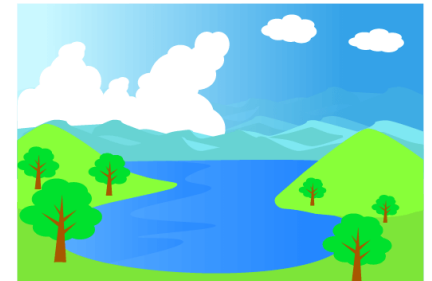

The correct answer is C.163m

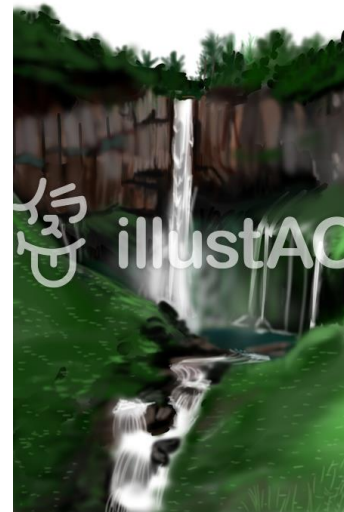
A.30 m

A large landslide occurred in Mt. Nantai and Senju Kannon enshrined was swept away in 1906.

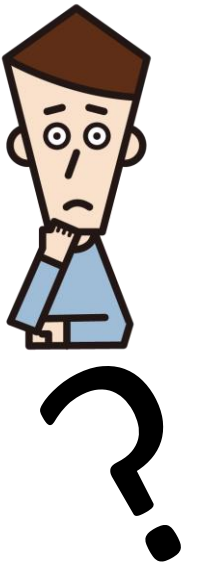
Senju Kannon drifted ashore and was enshrined here.

- C. To check for earthquakes.



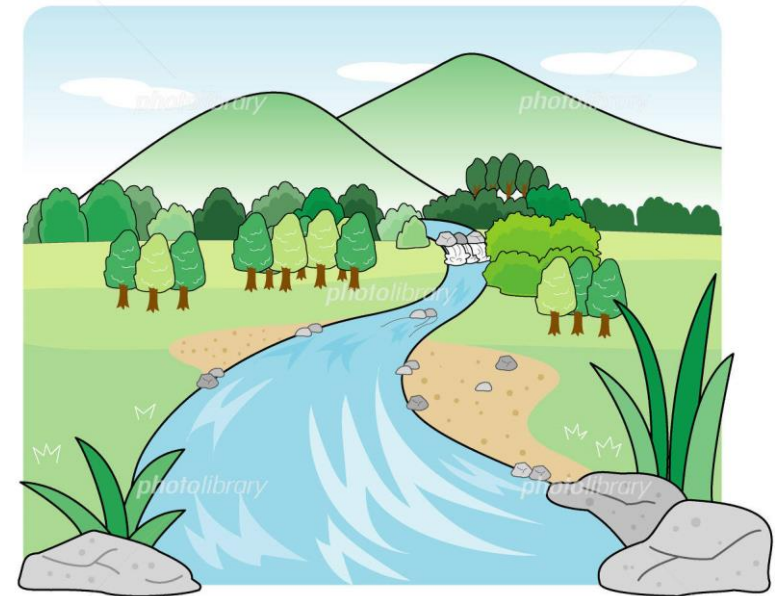
Answer12

It was named UDAIKANBA(Monarch birch) because of the fishing method.



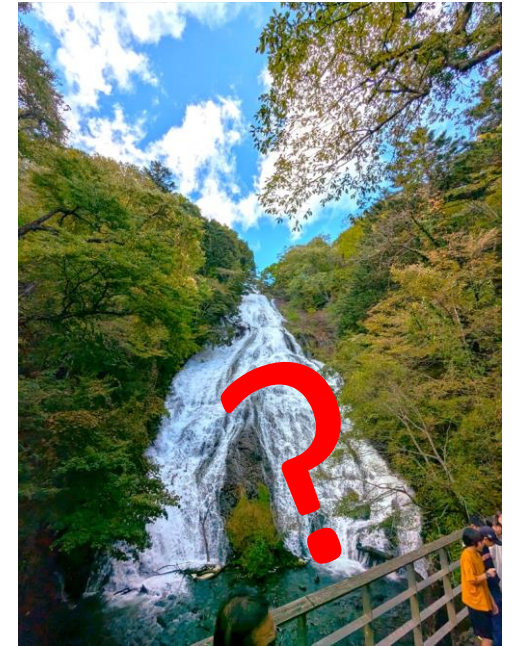
Question15 About Yutaki waterfall

A lot of water springs up from Lake Yunoko upstream. The overflow becomes a waterfall. Normally, the amount of water is about 3 tons per second.



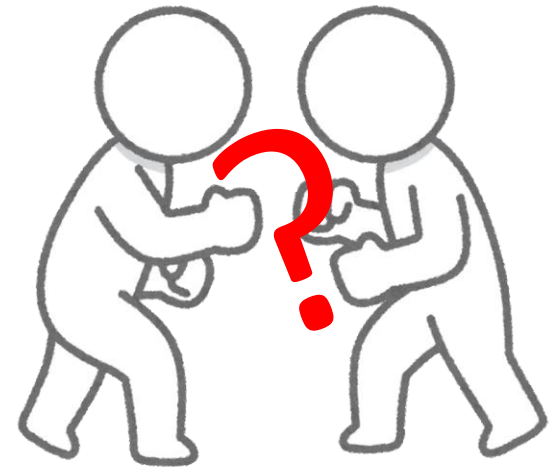
Question16 About Senjoahara moor

together to make it.



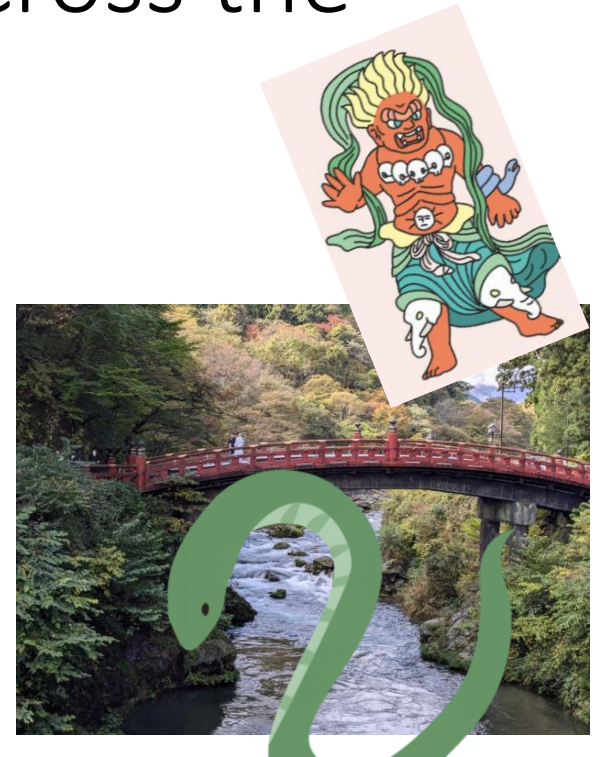
Answer18
